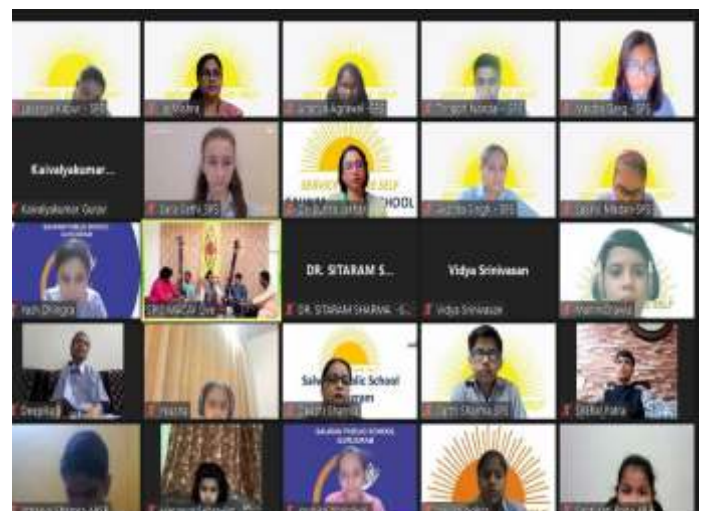
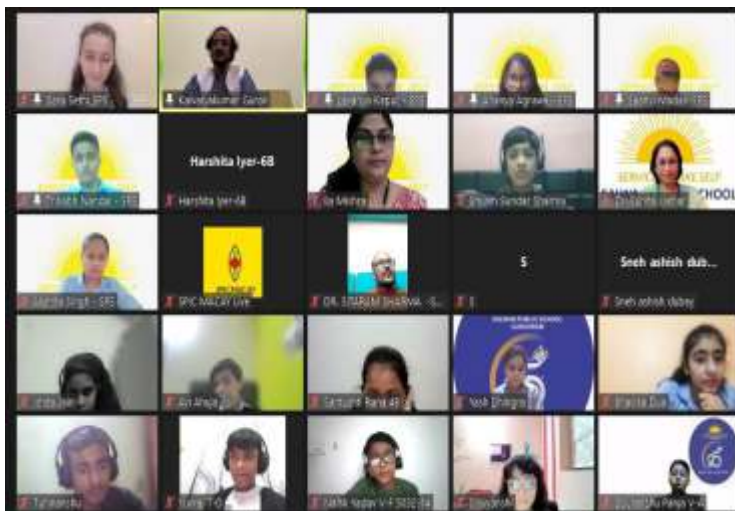
"The object of art is to give life a shape."- William Shakespeare

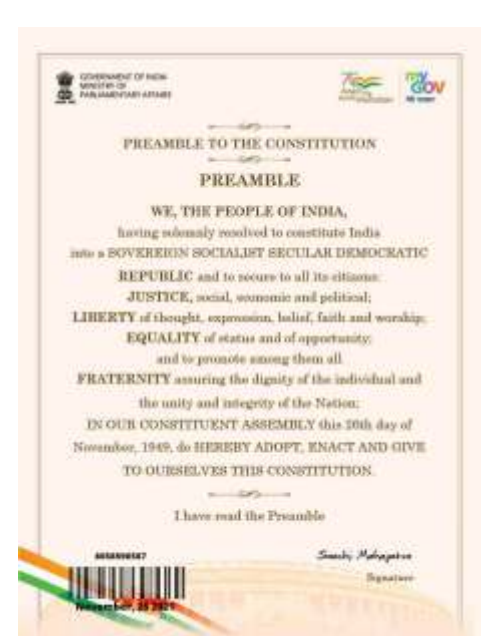
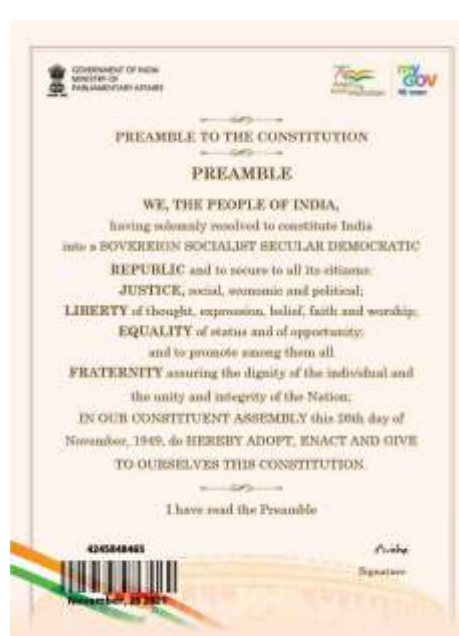
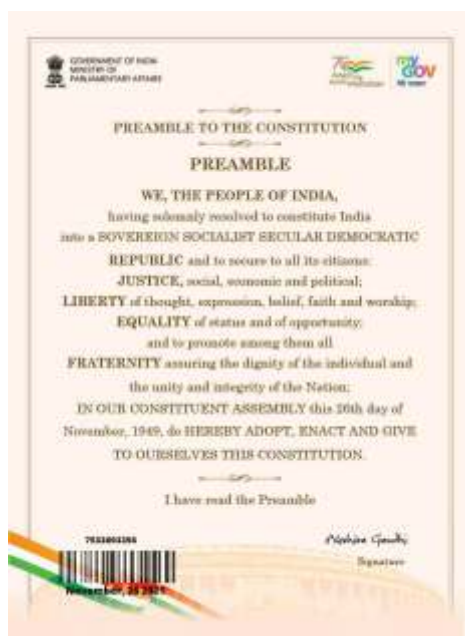
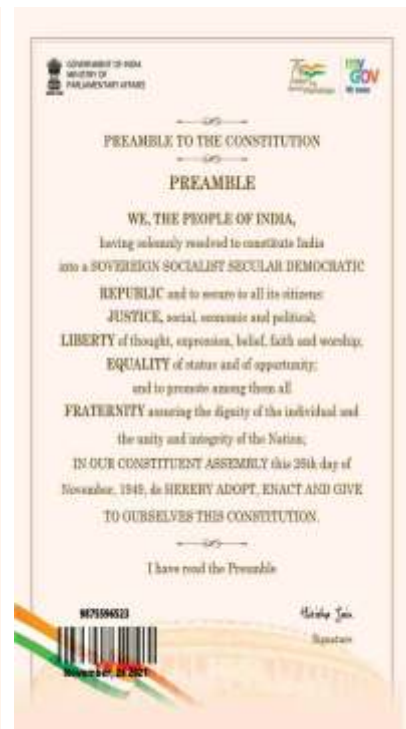
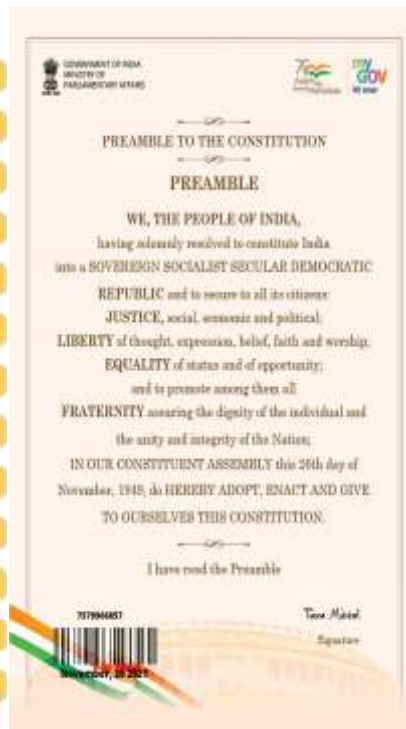
REJOICING GURPURAB

CONSTITUTION DAY

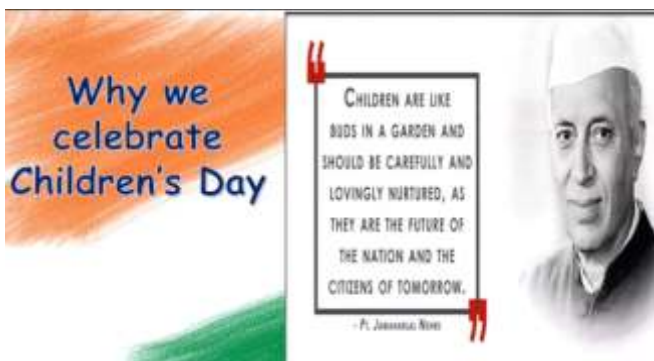

LET THEM FLUTTER, LET THEM FLY

Butterflies, Bumble bees, Orchard bees..... Have we ever shared our concerns about the diminishing population of these amazingly beautiful creatures who form an integral backbone in maintaining our ecosystem? They contribute greatly in successful completion of food chains. These consistent workers are constantly engaged in pollinating 90% of world's flowering plants and thus help in the production of seeds.

They form the food for others predators and birds. This is how nature strikes a balance and the order maintained. But with our changing lifestyles we are harming these small beautiful insects. We are destroying their habitats. After drinking juice or eating ice cream, we normally throw straws or ice cream sticks in open, which attract these innocent creatures towards them. These small creatures get stuck in the straws and ultimately die. The dwindling population of Monarch Butterfly in North America has the same story to tell. They migrate to Mexico during winter from Canada. On their way back, they cannot find any milkweed. The perennial milkweed, which is Monarch's sole food and breeding source is eliminated due to genetically engineered crops and agricultural chemicals. Wild bees suffer from parasites and pesticides, loss of floral abundance and habitat destruction.

We must therefore work towards conservation and alter our lifestyle to suit the survival of these organisms who weigh even less than a paper clip. Minimal use of disposable items, planting bee friendly flowers and limiting use of pesticides are some of the ways by which we can save these small creatures.

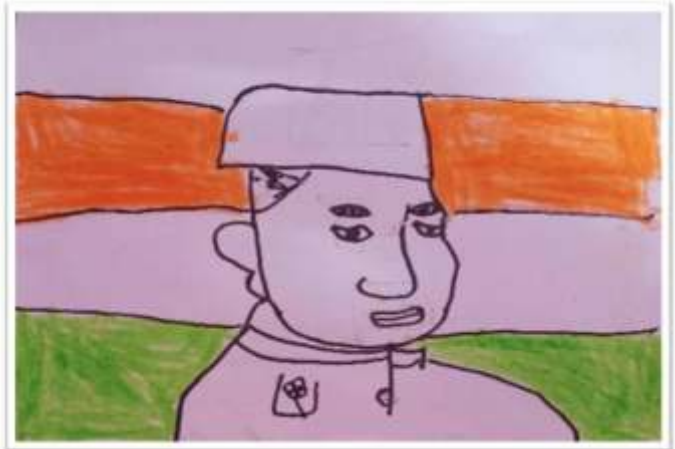
